Front-line Prosecutors, Sheriffs Endorse Judge Gableman

Sheriffs and district attorneys sign on to support Judge Gableman for Wisconsin Supreme Court

[Burnett County, Wisc....] Just hours after Judge Gableman filed his nomination papers for the Wisconsin Supreme Court to secure his place on the April ballot, the judge's campaign announced the support of several more law enforcement leaders, including additional district attorneys, assistant district attorneys and another sheriff.

Since announcing his candidacy, a total a bipartisan majority of forty-two sheriffs have endorsed Judge Gableman. Additionally, a notable list of 30 district attorneys, and a growing numbers of assistant district attorneys and police chiefs are lining up to support the Burnett County judge.

Judge Michael Gableman has a distinguished and wide-ranging legal career serving as a Circuit Court Judge, District Attorney, Assistant District Attorney, Administrative Law Judge, Adjunct Professor of Law, Deputy Corporation Counsel and private practice attorney.

Prior to his experience on the bench, Judge Gableman was appointed District Attorney for Ashland County (1999) by Governor Tommy G. Thompson and subsequently won election to the position. As District Attorney, he was the lead prosecutor on cases as diverse as arson, sexual assault, domestic violence, and white collar crimes. He also served as a front-line prosecutor in Marathon County (1997-1999) and Langlade County (1996-1997) as an Assistant District Attorney.
