## **More Police Chiefs Endorse Judge Gableman**

*Chiefs of Police throughout Wisconsin throw their support behind only candidate for Supreme Court with a law enforcement background.*

[Burnett County, Wisc....] Judge Michael Gableman's campaign for Supreme Court announced the endorsements of five more police chiefs today. They join an impressive list of law enforcement leaders from throughout the state who are throwing their support to Judge Gableman.

Wisconsin Dells Chief of Police Bret Anderson, Sturtevant Chief of Police Sean Marschke, Ladysmith Chief of Police Dean Meyer, Grantsburg Chief of Police Jeff Schinzing and Siren Chief of Police Chris Sybers join 12 chiefs of police who had previously endorsed Judge Gableman.

Judge Gableman, who served as a district attorney prior to becoming a judge, is the only candidate for the Supreme Court with prosecutorial experience. The other candidate for the court was a long-time criminal defense lawyer.

"I am incredibly honored to have the support of these brave police chiefs in my run for the state's highest court," said Judge Gableman. "I believe the job of a Supreme Court justice is to apply the plain meaning of the law to the specific facts of a case – not to look for loopholes to put criminals back on our streets."

Prior to his circuit court judgeship in Burnett County, Gableman served as Ashland County's district attorney from 1999 to 2002, where he was the lead prosecutor on cases as diverse as arson, sexual assault, domestic violence, and white collar crimes. He also served as a front-line prosecutor in Marathon County and Langlade County as an assistant district attorney.

Judge Gableman has quickly become the choice of most law enforcement professionals in Wisconsin. He has already been endorsed by a bipartisan majority of Wisconsin's sheriffs. Gableman also has the support of a majority of district attorneys and assistant district attorneys who have endorsed in the Supreme Court race.

The Supreme Court election will be April 1, 2008.
