More District Attorneys Endorse Gableman for Supreme Court

[Burnett County, Wisc....] Just days after announcing the endorsement of four District Attorneys from across Wisconsin, the Gableman for Supreme Court campaign received five additional endorsements from Badgerland county prosecutors.

Winnebago County District Attorney Christian Gossett, Washburn County District Attorney J. Michael Bitney, Langlade County DA Ralph Uttke, St. Croix County District Attorney Eric Johnson and Taylor County District Attorney Karl Kelz are all endorsing Judge Michael Gableman

“Judge Gableman is the clear choice,” said District Attorney Gossett. “Our Supreme Court should administer the law with common sense and fairness, and that will happen with Judge Gableman on the bench.”

The five district attorneys join Waukesha County District Attorney Brad Schimel, Bayfield County District Attorney Craig Haukass, Iron County District Attorney Martin Lipski and the District Attorney of Ashland County, Sean Duffy. These veteran prosecutors respect Judge Gableman and his impressive track record on the bench.

“Our campaign is gaining steam,” said Judge Gableman. “Every day we see more interest and more enthusiasm.”

Judge Michael Gableman has a distinguished and wide-ranging legal career serving as a Circuit Court Judge, District Attorney, Assistant District Attorney, Administrative Law Judge, Adjunct Professor of Law, Deputy Corporation Counsel and private practice attorney.

Judge Gableman was appointed Burnett County Circuit Court in 2002 and was overwhelmingly elected to the bench in 2003 with 78% of the vote. The last time Louis Butler faced the voters and his philosophy and background were screened by more than just one political patron, he lost by a nearly two to one margin.

The Primary Election is February 19, 2008. The General Election will be held on April 1, 2008.

Prior to his experience on the bench, Judge Gableman was appointed District Attorney for Ashland County (1999) by Governor Tommy G. Thompson and subsequently won election to the position. As District Attorney, he was the lead prosecutor on cases as diverse as arson, sexual assault, domestic violence, and white collar crimes. He also served as a front-line prosecutor in Marathon County (1997-1999) and Langlade County (1996-1997) as an Assistant District Attorney.
